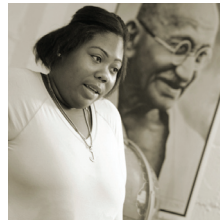

- Undertakes advocacy initiatives, such as public hearings, lobby days, and letter-writing.
- Equips members with the skills necessary to advocate for themselves and their families.
- Offers opportunities to network with Council members and community leaders.
